Internal Investigations

The Westerly Police Department investigates all complaints against department personnel, regardless of the source of such complaints. Investigating these complaints through standardized procedures demonstrates the department's desire and commitment to provide honest, efficient police service which will inspire public confidence in its personnel.

The Professional Standards Unit is responsible for investigating and/or managing inquiries into all complaints and allegations made against sworn and civilian members of the Westerly Police Department. The goal of the Unit is to ensure that the integrity of the Westerly Police Department remains intact. Each complaint will be objectively and thoroughly investigated, without bias.

In 2017 the Westerly Police Department interacted with members of the public on 48,316 occasions; this includes arrests, investigations, traffic stops and citations, motor vehicle crashes, and other type contacts. Of all these contacts, the Police Department had only two complaints investigated by the Professional Standards Unit. The Unit also reviews all use of force incidents. The following is a summary of the complaints and the dispositions.
